Mortgage Update


We continue to make good progress in paying down our mortgage. In the last year, we have paid over \$29,600 of principal on the mortgage, Since the inception of the mortgage in the fall of 2004, almost \$330,000 has been paid on mortgage principal; the outstanding balance has been reduced to \$71,000.

The required monthly minimum payment is \$2,130; however, we have been paying \$2,800 in an effort to pay it off early. This means annually, we are paying an additional \$8,000 per year on principal. At our current 4.5% interest rate, approximately 90% of each payment goes to pay down principal. At this rate, we can anticipate a mortgage burning party in January 2021.

Members have made designated gifts of approximately \$1,600 per month toward debt reduction; the remainder of the payment comes from general giving.

Almost 50 years ago, our congregation purchased land, built a new building, and over time built a parsonage and several additions to our church. Today we enjoy beautiful facilities thanks to the generosity and sacrifices of those who went before us. A big Thank You to all who are making extra gifts toward mortgage reduction.
